

## Do I need a password to access CEBS?

### **Answer: No, with Some Exceptions**

CEBS data can fall into one of two categories: Public and Private. Private data is the exception for which users need to login.

#### **1) Accessing Public CEBS Data**

All public data in CEBS is available on the CEBS website without a username or password (<http://tools.niehs.nih.gov/cebs3/ui/>). Using this interface, users can search for the data from specific studies or data types. Users can also use the Download Data button to download all public data (See [CEBS FTP Help](#) for more information).

#### **2) Exception: Accessing Private CEBS Data**

There are some instances where CEBS data is categorized as private. For example, recently performed studies that have not been completely reviewed are private before becoming public in CEBS. Private data can only be accessed via the Open My Data button (or at the address: <http://connect.niehs.nih.gov/cebs3/login/>). This area does require users to login with a username and password. Explicit permission by data owners is required to gain access to private data.

##### **a) Login Options**

Users logging in to access private data can use one of the following Authentication Sources:

- NIH – NIH users. Use your NIH username and password
- NIHEXT – Non-NIH users with NIHEXT credentials. Use your NIHEXT username and password
- CEBS – Non-NIH users with CEBS credentials. Use your CEBS username and password

Once you have successfully accessed the private data in CEBS you will see the CEBS Modules to which you have been granted access. If you have trouble logging in contact [CEBS-support@mail.nih.gov](mailto:CEBS-support@mail.nih.gov) for assistance.

### **3) Additional Instructions/Information**

- 1) 'CEBS Home' icon returns the user back to the CEBS Home page
- 2) Downloading and displaying data
  - Select the Download Data Icon
  - The next screen displays available locations to save data
  - Once a location has been determined, select Save
  - To access the data, go to the location where the data was saved
  - Open in the appropriate program
- 3) Flash movie running flex code for CEBS indicates a software platform is being used to create graphics or texts for CEBS
