The Laborers' Health & Safety Fund of North America (LHSFNA) is seeking a highly motivated **Safety and Health Specialist** to provide technical health and safety support to the members and affiliates of the Laborers' International Union of North America (LIUNA). The position reports to the Director of Occupational Safety and Health (OSH).

The LHSFNA is a joint labor-management 501(c)(5) trust fund. We are dedicated to enhancing jobsite health and safety, bolstering the health of Laborers and their families, boosting the competitiveness of LIUNA signatory employers and supporting LIUNA.

Selection of Specific Duties:

- Provide technical assistance, both over the phone and in person, to contractors, workers, management, the press and OSH professionals.
- Conduct worksite inspections and safety consultations to evaluate occupational hazards and provide recommendations that are compliant with regulatory requirements and industry best practices.
- Communicate clearly and concisely through reports, emails and other correspondence within the LHSFNA and to LIUNA and affiliates.
- Create and write Toolbox Talks, OSH publications, safety and health fact sheets and articles for the monthly magazine.
- Provide technical assistance through presentations and trainings in both classrooms and large group settings.
- Support initiatives that may include: subcontractor health and safety, silica, excavation safety, fall protection, ladder safety, water quality, asbestos, lead sampling and subcontractor oversight, noise monitoring, fall protection, indoor air quality support, chemical exposure monitoring, and heat illness prevention.
- Participate in and represent the LHSFNA at meetings with government agencies (e.g., OSHA, NIOSH, EPA, PHMSA, FHWA).
- Act as an SME on matters of occupational safety and health.
- Represent the LHSFNA and serve on committees working to develop national standards and guidance.

Position Requirements:

- Excellent technical writing skills
- Good communication, technical, organizational and research skills
- General understanding of the basic rubrics of industrial hygiene and occupational safety and how to apply them
- Familiarity with industrial hygiene sampling, equipment use and reviewing analytical results
- Ability to create and develop communication materials and work products related to technical, regulatory and policy issues
- Have knowledge of federal and state regulations relating to occupational safety and health
- Possess public speaking and presentation skills

- Understanding of the hierarchy of controls and their application to the workplace
- Proficient in Google and Microsoft Office Suite applications
- Overnight travel expected. Travel of 1-5 nights per month is not unusual (including some weekends).

Desired:

- Familiarity with roadway safety, pipeline safety, artificial intelligence and robotic safety, using BIM and drones for construction safety, and soil remediation.
- Familiarity with labor unions and labor organizations.

Education Requirement:

- Master of Science or Ph.D. in Occupational Safety and Health or a related field with three years of construction safety or industrial hygiene experience; or BA/BS and five years of relevant experience.
- CIH/CSP or ability to obtain certification.
