Webinar 4: Managing Inequities and Environmental Injustices Encountered on the Job Among Workers Experiencing Disadvantage

COVID-19 illness, infectious disease, and natural disasters have disproportionately affected high risk, disadvantaged, under-resourced, and minority workers. This webinar panel will explore challenges and opportunities for improving safety and health among these populations of workers, workplaces, and geographies. It will also address how comorbidities and disadvantages like underlying chronic disease, food insecurity, race, and income can impact occupational risk. Given the recent winter storm related events in Texas, we will also hear about how the lack of power and water across the state have disproportionately affected workers and the impact of COVID-19 in that region.
