The UCLA Labor Occupational Safety and Health Program (LOSH) is seeking an experienced hazmat professional to join our team!

LOSH is a nationally recognized center providing training and support to promote safe and healthy work environments. LOSH's innovative, high-quality training reaches more than 1,000 English- and Spanish-speaking workers each year—in Southern California and beyond. LOSH leads the NIEHS-funded HazMat Training Consortium, collaborating with partners in the Western states from California to Alaska and west to the U.S.-affiliated Pacific Islands. We are a leader in the region, preparing workers for jobs in environmental cleanup and restoration, disaster response and recovery, and emerging "green" industries.

The HazMat Trainer/Coordinator will oversee Southern CA training initiatives to protect workers who handle hazardous materials, clean up hazardous waste, and respond to emergencies. S/he coordinates LOSH's program of quality courses that meet the needs of workers covered by OSHA's Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) standard and related state and federal standards.
